

BECOMING A POLICE OFFICER

The Municipal Police Recruiting Regulations Act (1991) has standardized applications in Saskatchewan.



The basic requirements:

- 18 years of age (19 for Regina Police Service)
- Grade 12 or equivalent
- Current Standard First Aid and CPR certification (Level "C")
- Uncorrected* visual acuity of 20/60 in both eyes or better, OR 20/40 in one eye and 20/100 in the other eye or better, with no colour blindness
- No criminal record and free from criminal involvement in three preceding years (e.g. thefts, illegal drugs - detected and undetected)
- No criminal convictions for which a Record Suspension (previously known as a pardon) has not been granted. A copy of the Record Suspension is required.
- No criminal charges pending before the courts
- Canadian Citizenship or Permanent Residency Status
- Excellent physical health
- Good command of English, both written and oral
- Experienced Class 5 driver's license
- Post-secondary education and/or related work/volunteer experience is an asset
- Excellent communication skills

*The RPS accepts applicants who have had corrective eye surgery over three months prior to selection panel

Applicants must also:

- Have completed two years of post secondary education and/or extensive relevant work experience. Those who have will be given priority consideration.
- Submit to a polygraph
